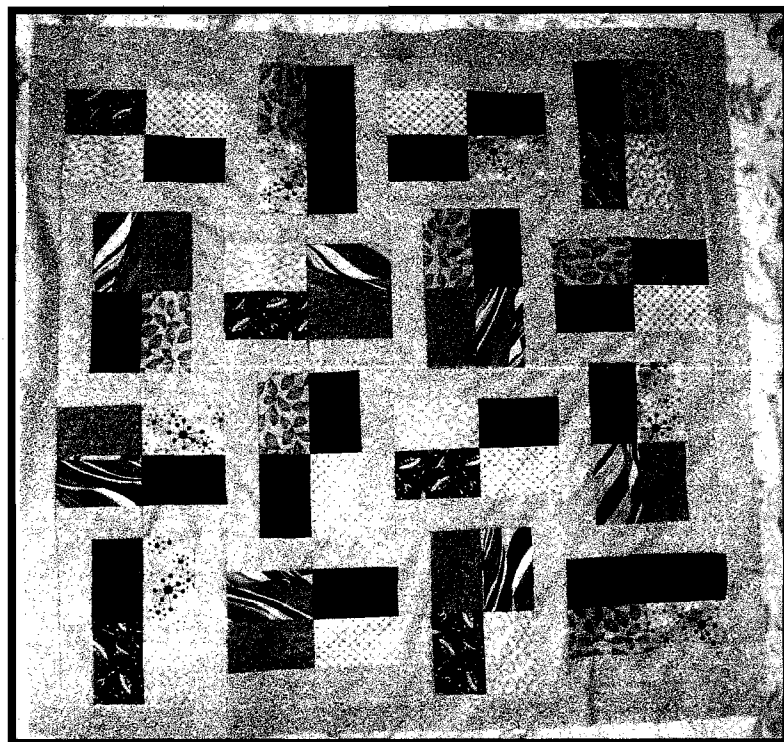


Chehalis Quilt Shop Quilt



Make this quilt as complicated or simple as you like, different fabric “fillings” give it a different look.

Block size = $10 \frac{1}{2}$ inches

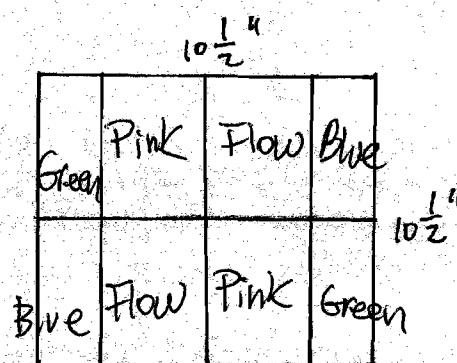
Blocks needed = 16

Finished Quilt with border = $44 \frac{1}{2}$ inches

Finished Quilt without border = $40 \frac{1}{2}$ inches

WOF = Width of Fabric, cut from selvedge to selvedge

Fabric Needed



Outer layers of strip set - 1 yard plus. You need 35" to cut, so check fabric to make sure you will have enough after you square up the edge. If you are not going to add the borders, 1 yd is plenty. Choose fabric that is intact, it is cut into strips from selvedge to selvedge.

Strip set “filling” - you need $10 \frac{3}{4}$ inch WOF strips. Choose 10 different fabrics, or as few as 2. Mix it up however you want. If you choose 2 different fabrics, you will need 22 inches WOF of each. Each strip set needs 2 different fillings.

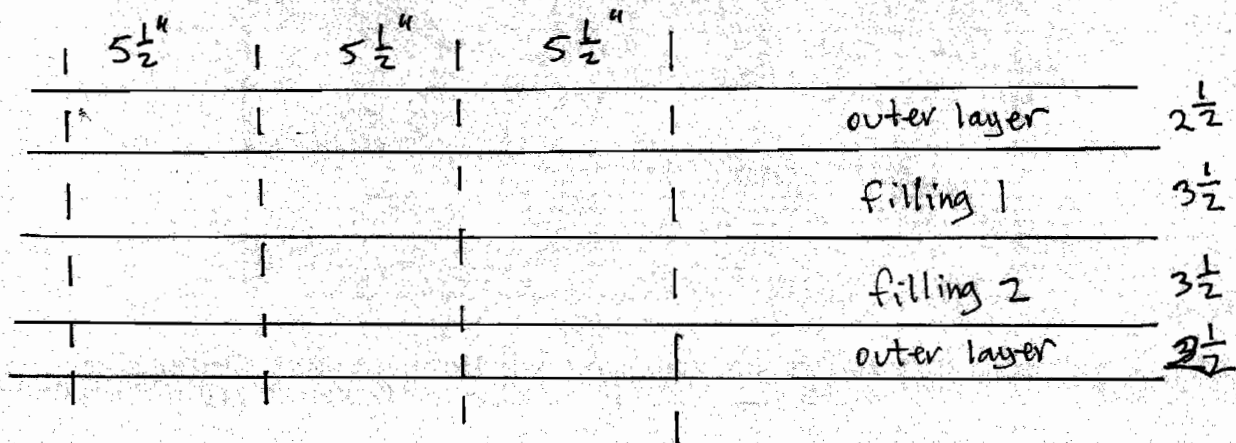
Cutting

Outer layer of strip set – cut 10 2 ½ inch WOF strips

Border – cut 4 2 ½ inch WOF strips

Strip set filling – cut 10⁵ 3 ½ WOF strips

Strip sets – make 5, using 2 different fillings for each one. Subcut each into 7-5 ½ inch pieces. Important – Do not press! You want to be able finger press the seams in the direction you need.



Make the blocks – select 2 pieces to make each block. Finger press seams so they will lie flat. After sewing, press strip set pieces, you may not want to press the center seam until after you sew the blocks together since you are rotating blocks. You will have 3 pieces left over. Make 16 blocks.

Lay out blocks, rotating every other one. Add border if using.

Super easy method – use one fabric for the filling. Cut four 6 ½ inch strips from 1 fabric. Cut 8 2 ½ inch strips of outer layer strips. (Cut 4 for border if using.) Make 4 strip sets as above, except subcut into 10 ½ inch blocks. If you use this method, check your fabric carefully first, you need at least a 42 inch strip set to cut your blocks from, some fabric is not wide enough.
